## Child Crisis Center

Did you know that Arizona ranks fifth nationally in the rate of children with substantiated reports of abuse and neglect, almost twice the national average (Child Welfare League of America)? Child Crisis Center (CCC) is committed to preventing child abuse and neglect. They accomplish this by supporting and strengthening families through education and intervention, by providing a safe environment for children to heal, and by recruiting, training and supporting foster and adoptive families. The Child Crisis Center is committed to ensuring that every child lives in a safe environment and has the opportunity to grow and create a successful future.

CCC opened its doors in April of 1981 as an emergency shelter for children with only seven beds. They have since provided a safe haven for over 12,000 children. They have grown to administer programs and services such as adoption services, anger management classes, children's character-building classes, children and family counseling, educational resources, emergency shelter, foster care services, military family support, parenting classes, and many more.

Child abuse rises when families are stressed. Due to the hardships brought on by the recession, the need in our community is greater than ever. "This is a really good opportunity to get involved and help your neighbors by volunteering and/or donating," states Chris Scarpati, founding Executive Director and CEO. Currently, the biggest needs at Child Crisis Center are summer items such as swimsuits, flip-flops, shorts, beach towels, toy shovels and buckets, diapers (swimmers and big sizes), and gift cards.

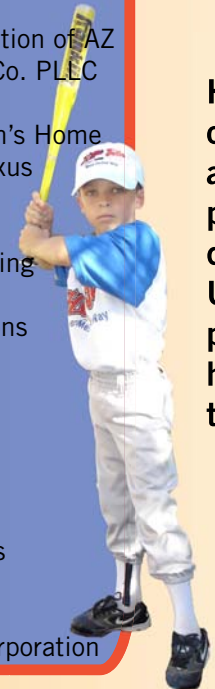
